- Eligible applicants for the Sally L. D. Katary Scholarship Award need to (a) indicate their desire to be considered for this award when submitting their abstract for the Colloquium talk to the SSEA, during the annual summer Call for Papers ([LINK](#)), (b) include a brief indication (about 300-500 words) of how the funds will assist in their research, and (c). note which category best fits their application (A, B or C).

• Examples of how one might apply funds from this award:

(i) If one is a Student/Young Scholar SSEA Member already residing within the Greater Toronto Area (GTA), namely category B, one might propose applying the award's funds to a subsequent presentation of one's past/current SSEA Colloquium talk at a future conference or scholarly venue outside the GTA, either within or outside Canada (e.g., at the SSEA Montreal chapter; ARCE; ASOR).

(ii) If one resides outside the GTA (i.e., category A), one might note the assistance of the award in aiding the transportation and/or costs of attending the SSEA Colloquium in Toronto (e.g., from elsewhere in Ontario; Canada; the U.S., or outside North America).

(iii) For applicants for Category C (see below), who do not require assistance in attending and presenting their current, talk at the SSEA Colloquium, one may consider

applying the award to aiding other Egyptological research ventures, including a trip to specific museums, collections, or libraries within or outside Canada, and/or participation in SSEA-affiliated projects (e.g., the Ptah Project; the Dakhleh Oasis Project; the Kom Firin Project; and possibly In Search of Ancient Egypt in Canada project).

(10). Clarifications for Category C:

In addition to providing an Abstract for the SSEA Colloquium, applicants for category C should provide a brief description of their proposed Egyptological research at an Egyptological museum, collection, or library (i.e., within or outside Canada: e.g., ROM; MMA; BMFA; BM; Louvre; etc.), which may also include participation in an SSEA-sponsored archaeological project in Egypt (see “Our Projects” on SSEA website), or a trip to a site (e.g., Deir el-Bahri; Medinet Habu), museum (e.g., Cairo Museum; GEM; Luxor Museum), or collection within Egypt (e.g., Cairo Museum archives). In addition to their current SSEA Colloquium abstract, applicants for category C should provide a brief summary (about 300-500 words) of their proposed research/study or participation in an SSEA-affiliated project.

(11). Post-research findings

Award recipients are also encouraged to consider, albeit they are not required, to submit a summary of their research findings to the Newsletter of the SSEA, or in the case of a sufficient Egyptological contribution, to the JSSEA (the *Journal of the Society of the Study of Egyptian Antiquities*).
